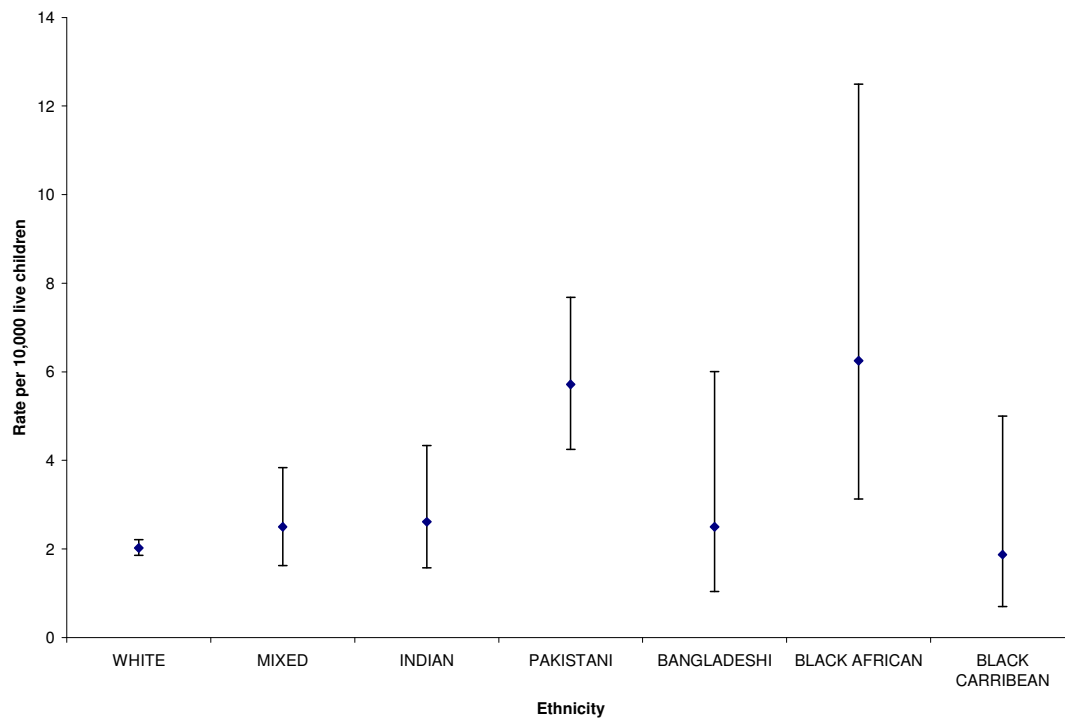


## Chapter 5

**Figure 5.6** Child death rate per 10,000 live children by ethnic group: selected England regions: 2006



The amendment has resulted in changes in the death rate, and its 95% confidence interval, per 10,000 live children in the White, Mixed, Indian, Pakistani, Bangladeshi, Black African, and Black Caribbean ethnic groups. The amendment is due to an error in the processing of denominator data.

Both Pakistani and Black African ethnic groups still have a significantly higher death rate than the white ethnic group. However, following the amendment, there is no longer a significant difference in death rates between the White and the Indian ethnic groups.

The following sections in the report are affected:

- **Key Findings and Recommendations: Key Finding 6** (page 6, second paragraph)
  - “The rate in children of Indian origin was significantly lower than for white children” is revised to “The rate in children of Indian origin is not significantly different to the rate seen in white children.”
- **Chapter 5: Notable Findings** (page 17, fifth bullet point)
  - “The rate among children from families of Indian origin was significantly lower than for white children” is revised to “The rate among children from families of Indian origin was not significantly different from the rate seen in white children.”

- **Chapter 5: 5.5.5: Ethnicity** (page 24, second paragraph)
  - “The rate among children from families of Indian origin was significantly lower than for white children” is revised to “The rate among children from families of Indian origin is not significantly different from the rate seen in white children.”
